## Engineering:

Residents and businesses alike will soon realize the benefits of water treated for the removal of hardness and disinfection byproducts by means of our new ion exchange water treatment plant. The plant is scheduled for completion in July of 2015. At this time work is approximately 25% complete with underground supporting infrastructure and equipment area foundation pedestals in place. The contractor is TLC Diversified, Inc of Palmetto, Florida. The cost of the new plant is \$4,828,000 funded in part by Grants from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection and the United States Department of Agriculture. Engineering for this project is by McKim & Creed, PA, headquartered in Wilmington, North Carolina.
