Western Hills Lift Station Update



The City of Bunnell Utilities Department has completed the concrete pour and fence installation for the Western Hills Lift Station located directly behind the Western Hills Heavy Equipment Repair Shop. After receiving approval from the City Commission for this portion of the project, the contractors and City staff coordinated the concrete pour, post installation, chain link fencing, double gate and privacy screen system promptly and proficiently ensuring timing was organized between all involved.

Steps forward to the new Ion Exchange Water Treatment Plant

After completion of the foundation for the new City of Bunnell Ion Exchange Water Treatment Plant in January, the construction of the building began and an amazing steel assembly of the structure and support system is taking place. As the construction continues we can now see the new plant coming to life.

The next step for our City's new plant will be the roofing which will happen within the next couple of weeks. According to the contractor's construction superintendent by the end of the month the treatment system should start to arrive.

Again, the City is pleased with the construction schedule and looks forward to the end result which is achievement of quality water for all businesses and residents in the City of Bunnell.



First African-American Elected Officials for City of Bunnell honored at Feb 23rd City Commission Meeting

To commemorate 2015 as the 50th anniversary of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, and February as Black History Month, the City of Bunnell honored our first African-American elected officials at their February



23rd City Commission meeting.

Louis L. Jackson (deceased) served three two-year terms from 1981 to 1987. **Annie Louise Johnson** also served three two-year terms beginning in 1987 and ending in 1993. A wall display honoring both commissioners was unveiled in our historical room adjacent to the Commission Chambers, where it



will remain on permanent display.

Commissioner Johnson, who along with many family and friends, was in attendance at the meeting, was presented with a framed memento commemorating the occasion.
