Bunnell's State of the Art Water Treatment Facility to Open Soon

Water customers of the City of Bunnell will be happy to know that beginning the first week of August 2015, our new Ion Exchange Water Treatment Facility will be placed into service. Here's how the new system works: Our drinking water is drawn from the ground via one or more of five public wells. The raw water is first aerated to remove hydrogen sulfide gas; the water is then brought into contact with an ion exchange resin which binds with naturally occurring dissolved minerals such as calcium, magnesium and iron, as well as organic matter, thus removing these constituents from the aerated water. The water is then filtered, disinfected and pH adjusted. At this point the water is then ready for storage or immediate distribution to our customers. The result will be tastier water that exceeds current State regulations.

Customers can expect notable changes with their water within days. The water will taste less metallic, lime deposits and iron stains will begin to subside, soap will lather up more readily and water will be less cloudy. By the third week of August, all customers will be fully on line with the new facility. Customers with seldom-used faucets are advised to let the water run for one minute on or about August 15th to flush the old water out of the pipes. On behalf of the Utilities and Engineering Staff, we sincerely hope you enjoy your new water. Our Grand Opening and Ribbon Cutting will be held Monday, September 28, 2015, from 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm at 100 Utility Drive, under the Bunnell water tower directly across the street from the Flagler County GSB.
